Valedictorian qualifications:

4.0 GPA, taking hardest classes available (one valedictorian chosen)

** WA State history requirement may be met in middle school

All fees must be paid to get diploma

- ▶ 2.00 GPA required for both cumulative and core

- ▶ “Double Dipping” - certain classes approved by the district can count toward two requirements (but still only 0.5 credit)

State Testing Requirements for Class of 2019

- ▶ Smarter Balanced (SBAC)
 - ▶ ELA (English/Language Arts)
 - ▶ Math
 - ▶ Computer-based
 - ▶ Level 1 through Level 4 scoring
 - ▶ Graduation requirement “cut score” in Level 2 range
 - ▶ College and Career Readiness (CCR) score Level 3 and above
 - ▶ Students who meet CCR standard in 10th grade will NOT retake test in 11th grade
- ▶ End-of-Course (EOC)
 - ▶ Biology only
 - ▶ Paper and pencil test
 - ▶ Level 1 through Level 4 scoring
 - ▶ Level 3 and above meet standard

Multiple retake opportunities for all tests.

Interpreting your student's transcript

GPA is unweighted

Class rank does not appear on the transcript

Rank is weighted

PSAT

- ▶ All tenth graders will have the opportunity to take the PSAT on Wednesday, October 19 at Roosevelt during the school day. Students do not need to register in advance.
- ▶ No need to prep - test scores, usually available in mid-December, can be used to guide practice and prep in the future
- ▶ Opportunity for a low-stakes, but real life testing experience
