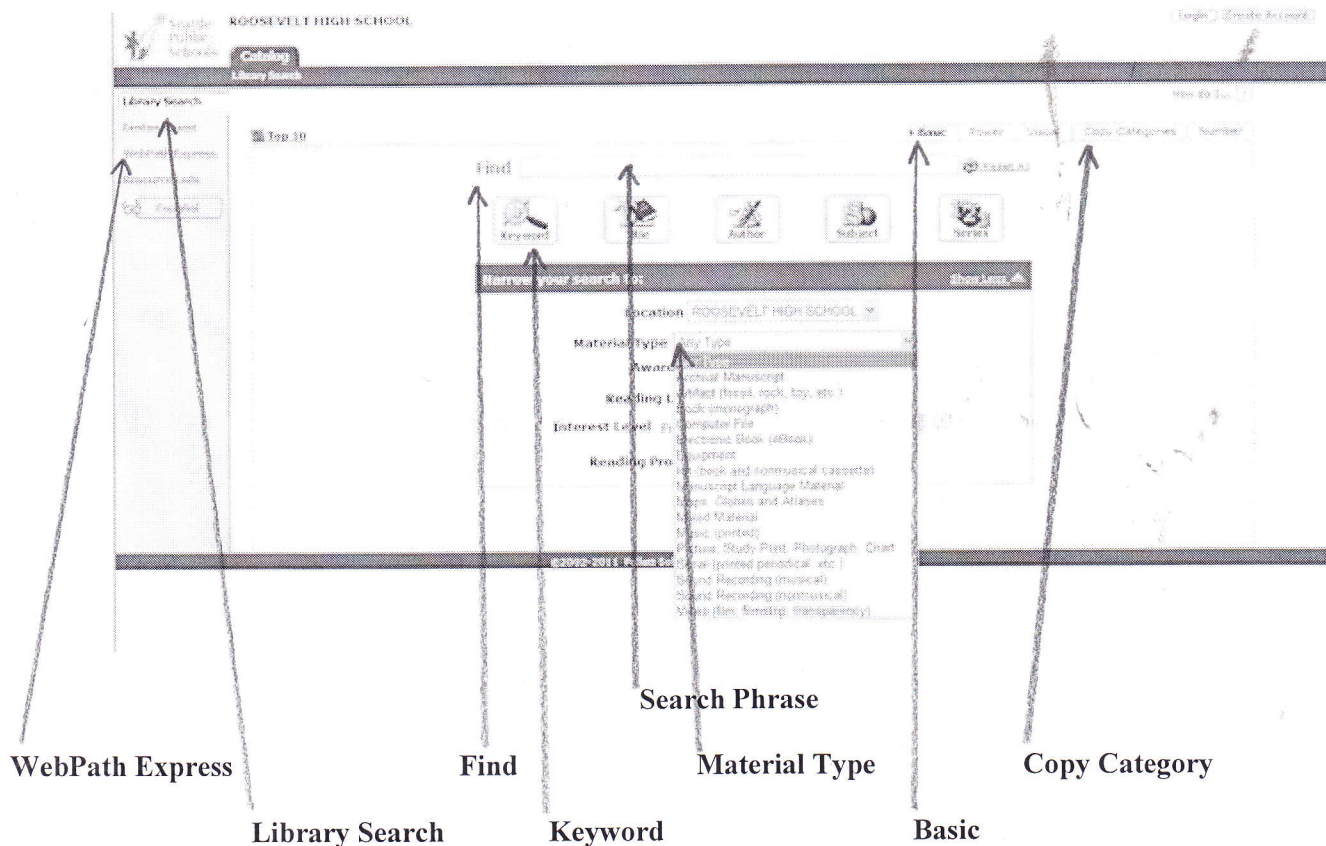

For this assignment, a library search under “Copy Category,” then eReference will give you the best results.

Additional keywords can be found under “see also” in the eReference article. Key words are particularly useful in sculpting a search on the internet.

- Write the search with Boolean Operators AND, OR, and NOT.
- When you are using these words as a search strategy, all letters are capitalized.
- When you have multiple words, but a single idea, use quotes.

How to access *ProQuest* from Library Fusion page:

- *ProQuest* is a full-text database of primarily newspapers and magazines.
- Choose "Online Student Resources" in the blue box on the right-hand side.
- From the middle column under "Magazines and Newspapers," select *ProQuest*.
- Type search terms using Boolean Operators [AND, OR, NOT] and quotes [" "].
