

## Instructions for RHS Course Selection for 2017-2018 Grade 11

- Counselors will come to your classroom to provide a registration workshop on either 2/27 or 2/28.
- **Course Selection:** Review your course history, graduation requirements, four-year plan, and courses in progress this semester, then choose courses for next year (both semesters). The Course Description Book for 2017-2018 with credit check sheets and course fee information is on <http://www.roosevelths.seattleschools.org/>. Click on the "Services" tab then the "Counseling" tab.
  - Choose six courses and an additional two alternates per semester. Please include an alternate for each Language Arts Option course, if you choose them. You may not choose to be a TA at this time—if you will be in the building you need to choose six courses per semester. Indicate your choices on your option sheet by writing the course name and course number in the grid at the top of the page. Remember that a year-long course is really two courses—one per semester.
  - After the workshop, go to [www.surveymonkey.com/r/ZL6LWW5](http://www.surveymonkey.com/r/ZL6LWW5) and enter the **course names** of your choices online. This can be done at home or in the Roosevelt Library (before or after school, or during lunch when not in use by classes.) **If any of the courses you entered online require a signature, collect the signature(s) on your form and turn it in to the Registrar's office (rm 101C) by 3/7/17, after you've entered your choices online.** (No signatures are needed? Then you keep the form.) Or, if you can't enter your requests online, please visit the Counseling Office before or after school between 3/6 – 3/9.
  - Some courses require prerequisites. Check the list on the back of this sheet. For more information, see Roosevelt's Course Description Book on the website.
  - Courses with an '\*' asterisk require a teacher's signature. See the list on the other side. Courses with a '#' require a counselor's signature.
  - **ELL students** will take core classes with other students in their grade level, but they will also take the ELD Adjunct support class. Family members may phone 252-4810 to speak with Ms. Pewitt, the ELD department head, if they have questions.
  - **Special Education** students will be assisted by their IEP teacher. Please call 252-4954 to arrange a conference.
- **Honors/AP:** Any student may opt for honors or AP classes. There are a few exceptions: (1) AP world language courses require a teacher signature, which may reflect a proficiency requirement. (2) Students taking LA Options may choose, at the beginning of the semester, to work for honors credit. LA honors contracts may vary between teachers. (3) AP statistics - see the Prerequisite List on the back of this sheet. (4) A separate contract and current Social Studies teacher's signature is required for AP US History (turn in to the Registrar in rm. 101C). (5) Math students should select the next course in their sequence. Changing tracks can only be done with teacher recommendation.

**Note:** When you have a choice between an AP or a non-AP course, judge your level of commitment before signing up for AP. There are usually very few seats in the non-AP class after the semester begins, and **moving out of the AP class into the non-AP class in the same subject often is not possible.** A separate registration form is required for AP US History. If you request AP US History but do not turn in a signed contract, you will be enrolled in regular US History.
- **World Language:** If you are *beginning* a world language, you should also list an alternate first-year language in the alternate elective field.
- **Family Health:** This course is only for students in grades 11 & 12 who have not taken 9<sup>th</sup> grade health; a counselor's signature is required. Priority is given to students who were not able to take Health in 9<sup>th</sup> grade. Space is not guaranteed for students who selected a World Language + music or theatre course of study in place of Health during 9<sup>th</sup> grade.
- **Physical Education:** If you request a PE course that you have already taken once in a Seattle Public Schools high school, please choose the course with the level "2".
- **Running Start and City Campus students:** Enter these courses and secure your counselor's signature. Please indicate which periods should be at Roosevelt and which periods should be Running Start on your form and turn that in to the Registrar's office, rm 101C. If you do not know whether you will do these programs or which periods you will be out of the building, sign up for six classes at Roosevelt. Then, **as soon as you know your plans**, talk to your counselor.
- **The Skills Center:** Aerospace Science, Animation & Game Programming, Cisco IT Academy, Health Sciences and more. These programs are located at various high schools in the District. Next year's

- **Tech Ed Courses:** Students sign up for the PTLW program and are divided into different courses after the start of the semester. See Roosevelt's Course Description Book for more information or contact Mr. Karl Ruff at [kwruff@seattleschools.org](mailto:kwruff@seattleschools.org).

**Class of 2019—Grade 11** Juniors will choose one Language Arts Option course per semester **or** a year of college-level LA, and a year of US History, and math. A year of either AP LA or CIHS is required to graduate. Students may fulfill this requirement in either 11<sup>th</sup> or 12<sup>th</sup> grade. Juniors may opt for AP US History.

General Grade 11: a year each of LA, US history, math, science; plus two electives per semester.
