

Please note: Any course with an \* requires a teacher's signature and one with a # requires a counselor's signature.

**Language Arts – Graduation Requirement** – All 9<sup>th</sup> grade students will take this Language Arts course.

INTRO LIT ISSUE & COMP 9A/B (blocked) – This is required for graduation and is blocked with World History 1/2. Two teachers collaborate to integrate curriculum, and students stay together for two periods.

**Social Studies – Graduation Requirement** – All 9<sup>th</sup> grade students will take this Social Studies course.

WORLD HISTORY 1/2 (blocked) – this pairs up with the blocked Language Arts course.

**Math – Graduation Requirement** – You must select one these year-long courses:

**Science – Graduation Requirement** – All 9<sup>th</sup> grade students will take the required 9<sup>th</sup> grade course:

For those students who have already taken and met all the requirements of Roosevelt's Physical Science course, then they may sign up for: BIOLOGY 1/2 (Please note that approval from Sci. Dept. If you have already taken a full year of Biology and passed the Biology End-of-Course exam, then you can select another

**Health – Graduation Requirement** – All students must take Health in order to graduate. Roosevelt offers Health in 9<sup>th</sup> grade.
