- **High School Honors** is a six-week residential, commuter, or online program in which students take BU undergraduate classes and earn up to 8 college credits (must be a rising junior or senior).
- **RISE Internship/Practicum** (Research in Science and Engineering) is a six week non-credit residential or commuter program in which students conduct scientific research in a university lab under the guidance of a faculty member. Must be a rising senior.
- **Academic Immersion** (AIM) is a three-week non-credit residential or commuter program for students to focus intensively on a single academic topic while enjoying and experiencing life on a college campus. This summer there are two basic tracks: **Introduction to Experimental Psychology** and **Introduction to Medicine**. Students must be rising juniors or seniors.
- **Summer Challenge** is a two-week residential program in which students take two non-credit seminars of their choice and experience life on a college campus. Must be rising sophomores, juniors, or seniors.
- **Summer Preview** is a one-week non-credit commuter or residential program in which students explore one subject of interest while previewing the college experience. Students must be rising freshmen or sophomores.

**This year's Summer Academy course offerings include:**

- **Biomedical Science and Human Disease:** In this introductory course, students will expand on the knowledge learned in high school biology and chemistry to explore the biomedical sciences including Microbiology, Immunology, Molecular Genetics, Clinical Biochemistry, and Hematology.
- **Using Drones to Map, Monitor, and Measure Our Changing Landscape:** UAS or drones, have provided us with new ways to map, monitor, and measure our changing landscape. In this course, students will learn how to operate drones and process drone data to in support of environmental mapping and monitoring.
- **Shakespeare in Practice:** In this unique course, students will train with teaching artists of The Vermont Shakespeare Festival, a professional theater that works in collaboration with the Department of Theatre at UVM. This course utilizes Shakespeare's *MACBETH* as a framework for full-bodied actor training including Technique, Movement, Voice and Speech, and Intro to Theatre Production/Design.
