State Testing Requirements for Class of 2020

- Smarter Balanced (SBAC)
 - ► ELA (English/Language Arts)
 - Math
 - Computer-based
 - Level 1 through Level 4 scoring
 - Graduation requirement "cut score" in Level 2 range
 - ► College and Career Readiness (CCR) score Level 3 and above
 - ▶ Students who meet CCR standard in 10th grade will NOT retake test in 11th grade
- Washington Comprehensive Assessment of Science, using Next Generation Science Standards (NGSS)
 - Students must take, but meeting standard NOT a requirement for graduation
 - ► Includes Physical Science, Biology and Chemistry content
 - Computer-based
 - Scoring system and cut scores not yet available
 - Students will take in 11th grade


Multiple retake opportunities for all tests.

Interpreting your student's transcript

GPA is unweighted

Class rank does not appear on the transcript

Rank is weighted



PSAT

- All tenth graders will have the opportunity to take the PSAT on Wednesday, October 11 at Roosevelt during the school day. Students do not need to register in advance.
- No need to prep test scores, usually available in mid-December, can be used to guide practice and prep in the future
- Opportunity for a low-stakes, but real life testing experience
