- If you are ambitious and want an educationally enriched experience, try one of these.

- If you have to go away for the summer and live with another parent, there can be a summer school at the local accredited high school. Have your parent inquire.
- Contact colleges and schools if no contact info has been given.
- Contact any college and inquire as to a summer high school experience. Let the Counseling Office know if you find ones that are not on this list.
- Many specialized experiences are intended for sophomores going in to their junior year, or juniors going to be seniors but not limited to that. Read/investigate carefully!

Boston University Pre College Programs Boston, Massachusetts

- **High School Honors** is a six-week residential, commuter, or online program in which students take BU undergraduate classes and earn up to 8 college credits (must be a rising junior or senior).
- **RISE Internship/Practicum** (Research in Science and Engineering) is a six week non-credit residential or commuter program in which students conduct scientific research in a university lab under the guidance of a faculty member. Must be a rising senior.
- **Academic Immersion** (AIM) is a three-week non-credit residential or commuter program for students to focus intensively on a single academic topic while enjoying and experiencing life on a college campus. This summer there are two basic tracks: **Introduction to Experimental Psychology** and **Introduction to Medicine**. Students must be rising juniors or seniors.
- **Summer Challenge** is a two-week residential program in which students take two non-credit seminars of their choice and experience life on a college campus. Must be rising sophomores, juniors, or seniors.
- **Summer Preview** is a one-week non-credit commuter or residential program in which students explore one subject of interest while previewing the college experience. Students must be rising freshmen or sophomores.
